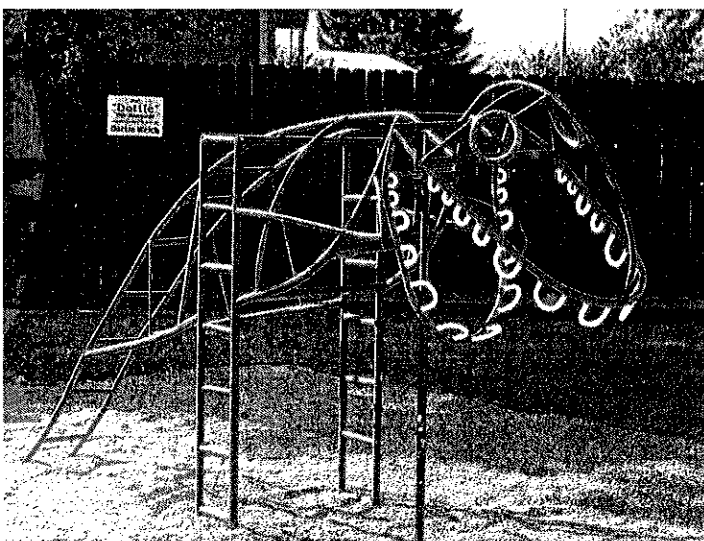

## College App Week Here in Hot Springs

Think of College Application Week (CAW) as a school spirit week, during which everyone works together to build excitement and awareness surrounding the college exploration and application process. The goal of CAW is to provide every high school senior with the opportunity to apply to a two-year or four-year college or university and to help them explore and prepare for postsecondary education, including certificate programs, two-year degrees, and four-year degrees.

Next Tuesday, all seniors in Hot Springs will be guided through the process of applying to a Montana college or university. Students may apply to one school that is deferring their application fee. Deferred applications mean students will not pay a fee when they submit their application, but at the time of enrollment the application fee will be added to their tuition bill. Students may submit multiple applications to colleges and universities that waive the application fee. Waived applications require no application fee.

Montana College Application Week (CAW) is a state-wide initiative coordinated by Montana GEAR UP, the Office of Public Instruction, the Montana Post-Secondary Educational Opportunities Council and the American Council on Education.
