



You can help your child master the multiplication and division facts by helping him/her practice every night!

**Children must read daily! Here are some questions to ask as you read.**

Nonfiction

- Why might learning about this topic be important?
- How does the organization and presentation of ideas help you to understand the information?
- How does your knowledge of the subject help you to judge the accuracy of the book?
- Is the text structure familiar to you?
- What particular words did the author use that made you change your thinking about the subject?

Fiction

- What might get in the way of what the main character wants?
- Based on what you know about the story, what are you thinking might happen?
- What do you think are the possible outcomes?
- How do you think that time period will influence the plot and characters?
- Now what are you thinking the big ideas of this story might be?
- How does what you know about the author's style help you to think about what this book might be like?

The students will be singing songs for Black History Month. They will learn some of the history behind the songs. They will finish the unit by watching The Reading Rainbow, " Follow the Drinking Gourd." which brings one of the songs they learned and history to life for them.
